

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

When you should wear a surgical face mask

Your team is being provided with a supply of surgical masks for use when a task requires you to be within 2 metres of others.

When used properly, a surgical face mask may prevent the spread of coronavirus before sufferers start to display symptoms. Masks must be used in addition to using hand sanitizer or regular hand washing. Stay 2 metres from others wherever possible.

If you have any of the symptoms of Coronavirus – a new, continuous cough, a high temperature (>37.8 C or you feel hot to touch on your chest or back) or you feel unwell – do not come into work and seek medical advice if required.

How do I use a surgical face mask?

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- 1) Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer before picking up the mask
 - 2) Inspect the mask for holes and tears
 - 3) Loop the mask over your ears and cover your nose and mouth as closely as possible with the fabric
 - 4) Avoid touching your face once the mask is in place
 - 5) Wear each mask for a maximum of 1 hour. If the mask becomes wet or damp, change it sooner
 - 6) Remove the mask, holding it as far from your face as possible
 - 7) Dispose of the mask safely, double bagging it in any suitable plastic bag. The bag should be tied and left 'in quarantine' for 72 hours before discarding as normal waste.
